## LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friend,

It's been a month since Christmas, when we heard those stirring images from the prophet Isaiah in praise of God: *The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light... The yoke that burdened them, the pole on their shoulder, and the rod of their taskmaster you have smashed.* This weekend's liturgy reprises this text, framing Matthew's account of the call of the first disciples, as the summons of the Incarnation at Christmas resounds into Ordinary Time.



Taken together, Isaiah and Matthew present the mission of the Messiah as the distribution of power and light. In other words, Jesus entrusts us with the energy of divine love.

All this was captured in a memory that came to me, like Isaiah, a month ago at Christmas, which I shared at Mass. As a boy in Atlanta, Georgia, whenever I'd ride my bike home from school I was always confronted by a very steep hill that began at the bottom of a one-block street called Nacoochee Drive. I attacked the slope straight on and worked up quite a sweat huffing and puffing on my three-speed bike. One day my older brother, riding next to me, showed me another approach: if I steered my bike up the hill on a slant, zigzagging from one side of the street to the other, the effort became manageable and I wasn't exhausted at the end of the climb. My life was changed.

Jesus summons us to see life differently. Through the humbling wisdom of the cross, we learn to climb the hill of love as human beings, little by little. "God writes straight with crooked lines," my grandmother used to say. In the grace of the Incarnation, I can too. In fact, like those zigzag fisherman, I'm learning: it's the only way to go.

## About our Crèche

The tradition of outdoor crèche displays at the Santa Barbara Mission goes back at least to the mid 1950s. At that time seminarians, in addition to building the crèche itself, fashioned crèche figures out of wood, cloth, and plaster of Paris. Father Virgil Cordano later decided to replace the local-made crèche figures with Italian figures by Fontanini. (Fr. Kenan is on the Right in the above photo)



Over the years, engineering and construction improvements turned assembly and disassembly of the crèche from a week-long task to one that could be accomplished in a day.



Thanks to a loyal cadre of volunteers, some of whom have worked on the crèche crew for decades, this tradition that began with St. Francis himself is carried forward every year. It serves as one of the focal points of Christmas celebration in Santa Barbara, attracting thousands of visitors—especially when the animals are in residence!

The crèche is erected the morning of the Saturday after the second Sunday of Advent (December 12, 2020 mark your calendars). Disassembly happens on the Saturday after Epiphany (January 11th this year). Volunteers gathered that morning at 8:00 AM to begin the work of disassembling the crèche and storing it for next year. First the fencing is removed, then the crèche figures are taken out. Next the palm fronds are taken from the roof, the

## CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

### Becoming a *Laudato Si'* Parish: Part 7

Of the many ways to care for Creation, some of the more obvious concern energy efficiency and careful consumption. We could establish guidelines for reducing waste at parish events: whenever feasible we could use washable rather than disposable napkins, mugs, cutlery, plates. That would require a volunteer kitchen and laundry crew. Instead of providing bottled water, the parish could sell reusable Sister Water bottles. If you're in the market to buy new appliances, select those given an Energy Star rating, which means better efficiency and long-term cost-savings.

The parish serves Equal Exchange organic Fair Trade coffee on Sunday. I'm a big fan of Just Haiti, a non-profit founded by a Catholic Relief Services professional who deals directly with coffee-farming cooperatives in that beleaguered country. We could reduce the use of coffee pods, which become landfill. At home I enjoy delicious Haitian coffee brewed in a reusable pod.

The Mission is in the process of installing energy-saving lightbulbs such as LEDs, an easy way to reduce electric consumption and are economical long-term. We could all get in the habit of tuning off lights when leaving a room. Think of that simple task as a prayerful reminder of our creatureliness, as inspired by the *Canticle of Creatures* and *Laudato Si'*.
